UNDERGRADUATE EXPERIENCE SURVEY

- O A regular survey on UBC Undergraduates.
- O Runs every year, except when UBC participates in the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) every three years.
- O UES ran in 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019 and 2021. Next UES is scheduled for 2022, before UBC will participate in NSSE in 2023.

The UES in 2021

O UES 2021 ran between January 18th and February 17th, 2021.

O Among 48 025 students invited to participate in the online survey, 8005 students answered at least one question and 6243 students completed the core section of the UES.

O Out of the 37 950 invited students from UBC Vancouver, 5992 students answered at least one question and 4661 students completed the core section. These students were enrolled in one of the following faculties/schools at the time of survey: Arts, Science, Applied Science (Engineering students only), Land and Food Systems, Kinesiology, Sauder School of Business, Forestry, or Vantage College.

UBCV Response rate (min to max): 12% (completed the UES core section) to 16% (all responses).

O Out of the 10 075 invited students from UBC Okanagan, 2013 students answered at least one question and 1582 students completed the core section. These students were enrolled in one of the following faculties/schools at the time of survey: Applied Science (Engineering only), Arts and Sciences, IKB Arts & Social Sciences, IKB Science, Creative and Critical Studies, Health and Social Development, or Management.

UBCO Response rate (min to max): 16% (completed the UES core section) to **20%** (all responses).



1) First, you can decide the parameters of the results.


Some variables might produce too many bar graphs for Tableau to show the actual percentages and number of respondents in brackets. In this case, you can hover your mouse over the bars to see the details.





Please rate your level of satisfaction with the following aspects of your UBC experience:







How satisfied are you with each of the following aspects of your educational experience?





How satisfied are you with each of the following aspects of your educational experience?





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

What are your thoughts regarding how often you receive the following types of email communication from UBC?






Did you participate in online learning at UBC last term (Sept 2020 – Dec 2020)?





You indicated that mental health condition has affected your everyday functioning. Has your mental health condition been diagnosed by a medical professional?





Did you receive accommodations (e.g. interpretation, assistive technology, or note taking) at your previous school before starting UBC?






Whether UBC Supports Inclusion/Diversity

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






In your community service learning, who was your community partner?

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

What is your main plan following graduation?








