Chilliwack Society for Community Living is looking for a Community Living Support Worker!

Why you should work for CSCL:

- Wage: \$20.52 \$23.90 per hour
- This position requires Union membership (BCGEU).
- Part time positions may to lead to Full Time positions (which include benefits such as Extended Health and Dental as well as participation in the Municipal Pension Plan, when eligible.)
- Recipient of the Canadian Non Profit Employer of Choice Award (neoc.ca) in 2017, 2018, 2019

What you'll do as the Community Living Support Worker:

- The primary function of this position is to provide meaningful, personalized support for a young female youth in her home and community.
- Perform safe transferring techniques and participate in all aspects of recreation and leisure activities (e.g. swimming).
- Promote and support Individual rights and facilitate meaningful community inclusion.
- Facilitate ongoing learning opportunities for personal growth and development of the individual.
- Facilitate opportunities for the development of personal relationships.
- Contribute to the development and implementation of personalized plans.
- Promote Positive Behaviour Supports and effective communication.

Qualifications:

- Education and experience working with children/youth with complex behaviours, mental health and health care needs in a residential setting.
- Demonstrated skills in the area of positive behavioral support.
- Must be physically able to meet the demands of the job, such as lifting/transferring and recreational activities
- Preference will be given to candidates who are able to demonstrate a clear understanding of Social Capital
- A positive and pleasant work attitude, effective communication skills and a solid understanding of consistent work practices are essential. This position will require working closely with external professionals.



Qualifications (continued):

- The successful applicant must possess or be willing to obtain a valid B.C. Class 5 Driver's License, CPR and First Aid Certification and be able to meet all other CSCL employment criteria (e.g.: Criminal Record Search, Good Health Certificate, Food Safe Certificate, etc.)
- NOTE: This residential service is funded by MCFD. Screening through MCFD's Centralized Services HUB will be required PRIOR to commencing position.

Schedule:

Shifts will vary to meet the requirements of the service; thus schedule flexibility is required. This is a "float" style position to cover shorts from vacation and leave requests. This position is guaranteed a minimum of 24 hours per week, posted 2 weeks ahead as per collective.

This position presents the possibility of working up to 40 hours per week at straight-time (The hours in this position may be worked over a 7-day work week consistent with Article 14.1 – Definitions)
