- Facilitate ongoing learning opportunities for personal growth and development of the individual.

- Contribute to the development and implementation of personalized plans.
- Promote Positive Behaviour Supports and effective communication.

- Education and experience working with children/youth with complex behaviours, mental health and health care needs in a residential setting and ability to work independently.
- Resourceful, Creative & Relatable (to the population you'll be supporting)
- Must be physically able to meet the demands of the job, such as lifting/transferring and recreational activities
- A positive and pleasant work attitude, effective communication skills and a solid understanding
  of consistent work practices are essential. This position will require working closely with
