 - **NOTE:** If your degree was obtained outside of Canada, you need to confirm it has been assessed for equivalency through the International Credential Evaluation Services. You must provide a basic report by the closing date of this posting to be considered.
- Minimum of one year full-time equivalent experience working with children, youth, adults, and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services.
